

## Workshop Report on Research: Definition, Methods, and Types

On August 21st and 28th, 2019, Mr. Subhodip Chatterjee conducted a two-day workshop for students on Research: Definition, Methods, and Types. The workshop provided an in-depth exploration of the fundamental principles of research, the various methods and approaches used, and the different types of research designs.

**Day 1: Defining Research and Methodology:** During the first day of the workshop, Mr. Chatterjee introduced the concept of research, defining it as a systematic inquiry that aims to uncover knowledge or solve problems. He discussed the key steps involved in the research process, from identifying a research question to collecting and analysing data.
